How to get there: The Canadian Nature Federation website gives these directions: "The sanctuary is 33 km southwest of Edmonton's city centre. Take Highway 16 west to the Devon overpass. Exit at Highway 60 (Devon Highway); head south for 13.2 km to Woodbend Road. Turn west (right) and drive 1.6 km to the next crossroad. Turn south (left) and drive 1.4 km until you reach a large wooden sign with a yellowhead blackbird on it."
